Isaac Bashevis Singer (21 November 1902 – 24 July 1991) was a Polish-born Jewish writer in Yiddish, **awarded the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1978**. The Polish form of his birth name was Icek Hersz Zynger. He used his mother's first name in an initial literary pseudonym, *Izaak Baszewis*, which he later expanded. He was a leading figure in the Yiddish literary movement, writing and publishing only in Yiddish. He **was awarded two U.S. National Book Awards**, one in Children's Literature for his memoir *A Day Of Pleasure: Stories of a Boy Growing Up in Warsaw* (1970) and one in Fiction for his collection *A Crown of Feathers and Other Stories* (1974). **A street in Surfside, Florida named in his honor, A street in New York City named in his honor (W. 86th st.).**
